Worried about speeding traffic?

We are looking for more volunteers to join our friendly Community Speedwatch group. The group meets weekly at various



points around the area with SID—our Speed Indicator Device. They monitor traffic speeds and refer the details of vehicles travelling in excess of the speed limit to the police, so the offending drivers can be sanctioned. Full training is given—

New CCTV at Hordle Pavilion & Rec

The Parish Council has substantially upgraded the CCTV system at Hordle Rec. New high quality cameras enable more of the playing fields and pavilion to be covered, ensuring a safer environment for all users.

War Memorial Gardens

You may have noticed that two trees have recently been felled at the War Memorial Gardens in Everton Road. This was in response to a request from our insurance company. There is now lots more light in the area and the Parish Council will be replanting with wildlife-friendly shrubs and a smaller blossoming tree to keep the area verdant. More details to follow.

The Parish Council has installed new signage at all it public open spaces. The

Cycling Map Powers On

The Parish Council recently voted to unanimously support a new "Tube" style map of cycling routes across the district. The routes aim to provide safe but direct routes for cyclists to easily get around the area. Hordle is in the centre of many of the routes, making it a key location. Cycling is great way to enhance fitness as well as being good for the planet.

SS8 Planning Application for 155 homes

At its meeting on 19th December 2023, the Parish Council voted unanimously to recommend refusal for NFDC for Bargate Homes' application to build 155 homes off Hordle Lane (reference 23/10661). The Parish Council had many concerns about

Yeatton Farm Mineral Site

We are pleased to report that following the Parish Council's objection to plans for gravel extraction at Yeatton Farm in Hordle, the site has been removed from Hampshire County Council's Mineral and Waste strategy update. Thank you to everyone who took the time to register their comments. The site proposed for Downton Manor Farm, off Angel Lane in Barton-on-Sea, remains in the proposals.

Asset of Community Value

In response to residents' requests, the Parish Council has agreed to apply to NFDC to have the Crown pub in Everton listed as an Asset of Community Value. This means that should the premises ever be sold for another use, the community will have time to put together a bid to keep the premises running as a pub. To do this, we need residents to tell us why the Crown is so important to the community so we can present this in evidence.
