Grants for Local Charities and Groups

The Parish Council has granted over £2000 in total to a variety of local groups over the past year. Groups benefitting from grants include Brockenhurst Young Farmers who meet in Tiptoe, Hordle Driver Group, Everton Pavilion, The YOU Trust and Victim Support. Tiptoe Fayre—11th May

The May Fayre at Tiptoe is back on the green at Wootton Road this year (weather permitting) 12 noon - 4pm. Hordle Environment Group (HEG) update

Most of the autumn/winter shrub pruning has been achieved. The small amount left will be checked for early nesting birds before work commences. The native daffodils planted in 2015 behind the bug hotel in Charnock Close are now rapidly increasing. Bluebells planted last autumn are growing well. Celandines provide excellent ground cover and their bright yellow flowers are enjoyed by bees. Thank you to the volunteers who keep

Yerville Gardens and Charnock Close looking good, along with the HPC Groundsman.

Golden Hill Update

Working Parties commenced in October. We are not as far forward as expected due to the wet weather. However, it was pleasing to see that all of the newly planted hazel whips had taken bar one.

A glade (open area allowing light in for low growing plants) close to the east entrance off Ashley Lane has been re-opened. We wait to see what germinates and it also gives space for the hazel planted 10 years ago. Other glades have mostly had to be left due to them being under water. The bottom path is getting attention.

Work stops at the end of March but monthly surveys of flora and fauna will be undertaken over the summer. This time we have last year's information allowing us to compare notes.

Spring flowers are brightening up the path edges, namely primroses, and dog violets. Snowdrops have increased in numbers and are busy setting seed for future years. We

regularly hear a variety of birds.

Thanks must go to our band of willing volunteers and especially Nick who keeps the website up



to date (hordleparishcouncil.gov.uk/golden -hill-woods) and Keith our bird expert. We always welcome new volunteers - do get in touch with the Parish Office.
