Join our team of Speedwatch volunteers!

Hordle Parish Council is working with a team of volunteers to reduce speeding vehicles in the Parish. The mobile monitoring equipment (SID) is currently going out to various locations across the Parish which have been identified as having a high number of speeding vehicles by the VASLR (the box fitted to posts which flashes and indicates your speed). Volunteers all receive training prior to starting at the roadside and all equipment

is provided. The project aims to reduce speeding by providing a visual reminder to people of their responsibilities, with speeders receiving a warning letter from the police. Do you have concerns about

Trees Fit for a King

The Parish Council has planted 2 new Sweet Chestnut Trees at Hordle and Everton Recs, to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III. We hope these trees will grow into fine, majestic specimens with lots of chestnuts for everyone to enjoy in the autumn months.

New surfacing at Hordle Rec Playpark

We have installed all-weather surfacing at Hordle Rec Playpark, around the base of

most of the kit there. We hope that the younger members of our community will continue to enjoy playing there and their parents and carers will have a little less washing to do!



New Bin at Golden Hill

The Parish Council has installed a new bin at Golden Hill Woods. It had been noticed that bags of dog mess were being left in the area so the Council hopes the new bin will help address the issue - please use it!

Golden Hill Woods update

The Working Party has been busy over the winter months creating glades and planting native blue bells, snow drops, marsh marigolds and celandines. Most non-native species have been cleared and the arisings left in situ to form beneficial wildlife habitats. The volunteers have also cleared the pond of Fools Watercress. The volunteers will scale back their work for the summer but they always welcome new faces—just contact the Parish Office.

Hordle Environmental Group (HEG)

Despite the challenging weather, the volunteers who look after the Parish Council beds in the Yerville/ Charnock area have worked an astonishing 300 hours. They have planted 500 native bluebells along the pathway to Acacia Road (opposite the bug hotel) and under the Triangle's hedge. Several shrubs and perennial plants were kindly donated by residents. The group has noted an increase in robins, blackbirds and sparrows who are occupying several hedges in the area. Bats, owls, great spotted woodpeckers, foxes, badgers and deer are either heard or seen. Areas being worked on now include the Yerville bench, the shrub bed by sub-station and the bug hotel bed. The Parish Council very much appreciates all the volunteers who give their time freely.
